CITY OF LEWISBURG Home Rule Plan Amendment

Introduction

In 2008 the Home Rule board selected four municipalities to participate in the original West Virginia Home Rule Pilot Program. In Phase III of the Home Rule Pilot Program application process, Lewisburg made application and was accepted as a Home Rule City.

Under WV State Code Section 8-1-5a(k), municipalities participating in the Municipal Home Rule Pilot Program may amend their written plans. For the reason set forth herein, Lewisburg is now requesting that the Home Rule Board authorize the following amendment to Lewisburg's approved written plan.

Problem: The West Virginia Code restrains restaurants and hotels during brunch hours by prohibiting the serving of alcohol before the hour of one o'clock p.m. on Sundays.

Solution: Lewisburg will enact an ordinance permitting any private club licensee or private bed and breakfast, hotels or restaurant to serve beer, wine and alcoholic liquors after the hour of 10:00 a.m. on Sundays.

Supporting Notes: A "brunch bill" to achieve this result was passed by the West Virginia Legislature, with support from the delegation representing Lewisburg, as well as restaurants in the City, but with the requirement that each county hold a vote to determine whether alcohol may be sold in that county prior to 1:00 p.m. on Sunday. Because it is unclear whether a county would choose to put this on a ballot for a vote by the citizens, the City requests the authority through Home Rule to regulate the time, on Sundays, at which restaurants may serve beer, wine and liquor. The ability to serve alcohol before 1:00 p.m. on Sundays should attract business to local establishments stimulating tourism and the local economy.

Ordinance 261

"AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF LEWISBURG TO SUBMIT TO THE MUNICIPAL HOME RULE BOARD A PROPOSED AMENDMENT, ATTACHED HERETO AS EXHIBIT A, TO THE CITY OF LEWISBURG MUNICIPAL HOME RULE PLAN CONSISTENT WITH W.V STATE CODE SECTION 8-—1-5A, REQUESTING APPROVAL TO ALLOW THE SALE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES BY CERTAIN ALCOHOL BEVERAGE CONTROL ADMINISTRATION CLASS "A" LICENSE HOLDERS BEGINNING AT 10:00 A.M. ON SUNDAYS."

- WHEREAS, the owners of restaurants and hotels in the City have indicated that there is a market for brunch services on Sundays, and that current restrictions on hours of Sunday alcohol service imposed by State law stifle Sunday morning brunch attendance; and
- WHERAS, the Greenbrier County Convention and Visitor's Bureau and its Board of Directors, which is composed of civic leaders and people involved in the City's hospitality and tourism industries, fully support the City's use of Home Rule to allow earlier Sunday alcohol service in Lewisburg thereby enabling restaurants and hotels in the City to be fully operational on Sunday to enhance the City's image in the eyes of business and leisure travelers and enrich the experiences of visitors to Lewisburg; and
- WHERES, the city has determined that allowing alcohol sales at Sunday morning brunch service within the City will produce more revenue and strengthen state sales tax revenues, and increase earnings for servers and other employees working in the hotels and restaurants in the City; and
- WHEREAS, the City's Comprehensive Plan envisions the reinforcement of Lewisburg's position as the Greenbrier Valley region's entertainment and cultural destination, and the active promotion of Lewisburg as a city that offers a range of lifestyle choices in order to attract new residents to the City and retain its current residents; the establishment of an earlier Sunday alcohol service is another way for the City to meet these goals and strengthen its social vitality;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEWISBURG, WEST VIRGINIA;

That, on behalf of City of Lewisburg, the Mayor, the City Attorney and the City Administration are hereby authorized and requested to submit to the Municipal Home Rule Board a proposed amendment, attached hereto as Exhibit A, to the City of Lewisburg Municipal Home Rule Plan consistent with W.V. State Code Section 8-1-5a, requesting approval to allow the sale of alcoholic beverages by certain Alcohol Beverage Control Administration Class "A" license holders beginning at 10:00 a.m. on Sundays.


