The City of Chester has completed its second full calendar year under the 1% Municipal Sales & Use Tax Home Rule Program and has received a total of \$337,772.11 during the 2023 year. This is a 2,320.45 increase from last year to this year which we believe is a result of tax papers reporting property and an increase in product costs. Beginning July 1, 2021 the B&O tax rates for Amusements and Rents and Royalties were eliminated as well as retailers and services were each reduced causing the City to have a decrease in the amount of B&O tax that was collected. The decrease in B&O revenue was replaced by the implementation of Home Rule.

The 1% Municipal Sales & Use tax revenue has provided the City of Chester the ability to replace and repair some existing catch basins and drain lines that have caused flooding in parts of the City. Also, the City was able to complete another large paving project that fixed multiple roads that were a nuisance for the City residents that was not possible in previous years due to not having enough funding.

All municipalities should be cautious about overestimating the amount of revenue they will receive from Home Rule. From one year to the next there was only a slight increase of less than 1%.
